



Second Call for Submissions to the ICM Summer School 2026 for Doctoral Students

Dear doctoral students of the EARLI SIG 8,

We are pleased to announce this second call for submissions, which includes an extension of the submission deadline to January 13, 2026.

It is with great pleasure that we share that, as it is our SIG tradition, the International Conference on Motivation and Emotion (ICM) 2026 will be preceded by the Summer School for doctoral students. This Summer School will focus on topics of motivation and emotion and will be held on **June 20th and 21st in Lisbon, Portugal.**

Why go to this Summer School?

In this Summer School, doctoral students will be given the opportunity to present and discuss their own research projects in the field of motivation and emotion. The activities held during these two days will rely on mutual exchange, constructive criticism and shared expertise with the goal of improving the research projects, while still fostering personal and professional growth of all participants. Where will the Summer School happen?

This Summer School will be held at [WOT Sarrazola Soul](#), located in Colares, Sintra. This calm retreat is located just 5 minutes from Praia Grande and near major landmarks like Palácio da Pena and the Sintra mountains.

Submission Guidelines and Procedure

Candidates must write their proposals in English and submit it through the EARLI submission system: <https://www.earli-eapril.org/>. Proposals should be submitted between the 31st of October and the 13th of January. A maximum of 25 participants will be accepted for the Summer School, and decisions of acceptance will be sent by 28/02/2026. Due to the limited number of available spots, priority will be given to first-time applicants and proposals that align with the themes of motivation and emotion.

Individual submissions could take one of two formats: a) a focus on the entire dissertation project; or b) a focus on a specific study included in the dissertation project. Considering the applicants' choice, their submission should include the following components:

(a) Dissertation Project	(b) Specific study
